Running for state office can feel overwhelming, but don't worry! Here are some tips I wish I had known when I ran for state office for the first time.

- Double-Check Your Application: Review every part of it multiple times, making sure nothing is missing.
- **Prepare Your Campaign Early:** Start planning materials before your receive your application results, better to get ahead!
- Master your Speech: Recite your speech until you can say it at any given moment.
- Know Your Campaign Inside Out: Be clear about your goals and platform to answer any
 questions members may have for you.
- Be Authentic: Make sure to show your own personality in everything you do, being authentic makes you more memorable and relatable to members.
- Get Rest: Especially during State, being a candidate is tiring work, eat well, and sleep well to be at your best every day of conference.

Fundraising Ideas

Community Sponsorship Drive

Reach out to local businesses for sponsorships. Offer to feature their logo on chapter materials, shirts, or banners displayed at competition. Gaining your chapter some big financial support.

Crowdfunding Campaign

The holiday and winter season is the ideal time to launch your fundraising campaign on platforms that allow donations. Starting early can provide a boost to your chapter, making you well-prepared for when State Conference approaches.

Calendar Fundraiser


CTE Month By: Dalena Do

A- APPRECIATE: thank your advisors for something they've done for you specifically or your chapter as a whole


B-BUY: It doesn't have to be something expensive or big but even something like their favorite food can make their day. Plan Ahead! Get your chapter to pitch in!


If you have not noticed already, this year you are allowed to have access the rubrics and the criteria for each event through your student membership account. All you have to do is follow these couple of steps!

First, go to the National TSA website, tsaweb.org and find the student login to sign into your student account, seen in the photo to the right.



Once you have logged in this is the screen you will see. Go to the Total TSA tab and click on it, as seen on the left.

Now that you are in Total TSA, scroll down until you see the Student Member Competition Guidelines and click view to see the whole document.





Inside this pdf, you can see all the guidelines for each project, either high school or junior high. Good luck with your projects and regionals!! Hope to see you guys at state!!



Tips for Competition By: Aren lendership Tenn



- 1. Do your research on the rules of any competition
- 2. Please double check where and how you need to submit your project ahead of the time.
- 3. Make sure to take a look at the Go's and No Go's
- 4. Check submission deadlines
- 5. Look at what you need for documentation requirements




- Read the Competitive Event Guidelines THOROUGHLY. Some events have very specific requirements which, if not followed, could result in you being disqualified. If you do not have access to this document, ask your advisor for it.
- Bring a device with an internet connection (especially if you have a testing event). While schools typically have internet and devices, it is best to be prepared in the case that all devices are in use or the internet is running slow.
- Any specific documentation forms for certain projects can be found in the TSA Student Membership site.
- It is a good idea to have either your advisor or peers look through your documentation for spelling and grammar errors, or for any further advice that could give you an advantage.
- Know your schedule for events, including where you need to be, when you need to be there, and what you need to have.
- Know the difference between your event rules and general rules, make it your goal to have a working understanding of not only your event rules but the general rules for all of the events.
- Make sure you have the adequate attire for your competition (Royal Blue TSA Shirt, Gray Slacks/Skirt, Black Shoes). If you are competing in Chapter Team, make sure you have the Blazer. Order the attire EARLY! Shipping takes time.
- For speaking/presentation events, get together with your teammates and practice beforehand. While in many events it is the content of the project that is more important, the quality of presentation also plays a significant role in the judge's perception of your work. Use the presentations and interviews to let your work shine!
