
Note: In order to participate in the Regional Conferences, members must notify the Regional Association by December 1 annually and be registered with National TSA before the conference registration deadlines for their Region.





CONTEST OVERVIEW:

Participants will create and design a lapel, trading pin for the Texas TSA members to wear and trade during the National TSA Conference.

Participants design a high-quality lapel pin including the following elements in some manner:

- State of Texas (shape, words, etc.)
- TSA (or complete spelling)
- Current year
- Current national conference site (city and state)
- National Conference Theme

Pin Guidelines

- A maximum of 5 colors.
- The pin design will not exceed 1.5 x 1.5 inches after manufacturing.
- The submission art must be sent with dimensions of 5" x 5".
- Pins cannot include any copyrighted material.
- Pin designs must be computer generated and saved as a PNG file type for submission.

Programs & Awards



Since 1984, the National Technical Honor Society (NTHS) has been the honor society for Career and Technical Education (CTE), serving high schools, career centers, community and technical colleges, and universities. Recognizing over 60,000 new members and awarding nearly \$300,000 in scholarships annually, NTHS exists to advocate for and empower all students to pursue the technical and academic skills needed to build their careers and a skilled global workforce. NTHS achieves this through career development, leadership development, service, and recognition opportunities. In June 2023 it was jointly announced that the Technology Student Association (TSA) and NTHS have formed a partnership to provide these benefits to TSA members.

At the 2026 National TSA Conference, NTHS will award three (3) \$1000 academic scholarships to eligible applicants who hold dual membership with NTHS and TSA.

A TSA student member must be nominated for NTHS membership by a school's NTHS chapter advisor (the school the student attends must have a current NTHS chapter). 1SA Achievement Program Pathways to Excellence



The TSA Achievement Program, Pathways to Excellence encourages TSA student members to engage in the areas/categories of service leadership, STEM immersion, and personal/professional development. Students participate in activities in these areas and have the opportunity to earn sequentially a bronze, silver, and gold award at the local, state, and national level, respectively.

Completion of one activity in each area/category – for a total of three completed activities per level – is required for bronze, silver, and gold award eligibility.

Members submit documentation of their activities for each level via the TSA Student Member Site. Chapter advisors are responsible for verifying the successful completion of a member's activities for each level.

Bronze awards are typically presented at the chapter or district level during special award assemblies, regional conferences, TSA banquets, etc. Recognition of silver award recipients is managed at the state level, usually at state conferences. Gold award recipients are recognized at the national TSA conference.

Bronze and silver award pins are available for purchase through the TSA Store at https://tsastore.mybrightsites.com, as follows:

- Bronze: Chapters advisors must use a code found under the Total TSA tab in the TSA chapter advisor site – to purchase Bronze award pins for eligible members. (Recipient responsibility for pin fees, if required, is determined at the local level.)
- Silver: State advisors must use a code found under the Total TSA tab in the TSA state advisor site to purchase Silver award pins for eligible members. (Recipient responsibility for pin fees, if required, is determined at the state level.)
- Recognition pins for the Gold level award have no fees; pins will be distributed at the annual national TSA conference.

Achievement program activities and verifications are subject to audit by the state TSA advisor and/or national TSA.

Texas TSA Statesman Degree



The Texas TSA Statesman degree recognizes TSA members who excel in knowledge of the organizations foundation and history.

There are two levels to the Statesman degree:

- The Lone Star Degree
- The Texan Degree

The two levels must be taken in order and the Lone Star must be earned before sitting for the Texan. The Lone Star exam is given at a Regional Conference and on Statesman Day. To obtain the Lone Star a member must pass the Lone Star exam with a minimum score of 75%.

The Texan exam is given twice a year on Statesman Day and at the Annual State Conference. To obtain the Texan, the Lone Star degree must be earned first and then a minimum score of 80% must be earned on the Texan exam.
